PATENTS, DESIGNS, AND TRADE MARKS BILL.

The Hon. Mr. G. F. RICHARDSON, in Committee, to move the following new clause after clause 70:—

Trade mark for artificial manures to be accompanied by analysis.

70A. No trade mark shall be registered for artificial manures manufactured in the colony unless accompanied by a chemical analysis setting forth the component parts of the substance of such manure.

A copy of the said analysis shall, before sale or exportation, be indorsed on or affixed to every bag, box, or other parcel of the manure to which such trade mark is attached, and shall be deemed to form part of such trade mark.

REPRESENTATION AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. BARRON to move, as an amendment to the Question that the Representation Amendment Bill be now read a second time,—

That, the present Parliament having already passed an Act reducing the number of members, subject to the existing quota, it is undesirable to disturb the decision then arrived at without further reference to the constituencies.

Dr. FITCHETT, when the Representation Act Amendment Bill is in Committee, to move, That subsection 2 of section 2 be amended by striking out the words "any part of which is within one mile from any part of any of the said cities."
