## ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS SALE CONTROL BILL.

Mr. HARKNESS, in Committee, to move the following amendment:—

In subsection 7, clause 10, line 35, to strike out the words “shall have the right of,” and substitute in lieu thereof, “may have.”

Mr. TANNER in Committee, to move as an addition to clause 16—

Whenever a licensee is convicted of an offence which is indorsed on his license, such conviction or convictions shall be indorsed on any license afterwards issued in respect of the same premises, whether to the same person or any other licensee, and irrespective of any change or transfer of the license; and on a third indorsement such license shall be absolutely cancelled.

Notwithstanding anything in this or any other Act contained, no license whatever shall be issued to any applicant in respect of the premises in question for the space of five years from the date of the third indorsement.

## RATING ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. HOGG, to move the following amendments:—

In clause 9, line 21, to omit the words after “carry,” and substitute in lieu thereof, “a penalty of ten per cent.”

In clause 20, lines 52 and 53, to omit the words “by a like majority as is required by the law last mentioned to carry a proposal to raise a special loan,” and substitute in lieu thereof, “a majority of those voting.”
