NOTICE OF MOTION.

 Mr. Wason to move, when in Committee on the Rating Bill, the following clause, after Clause 13:—

Every person who shall object to the valuation of any rateable property included in any rate, or in the amount assessed thereon, shall deliver to the Clerk of the Board, at any time within one month after such rate is made, a statement in writing of the grounds of his objection; and all such objections shall be heard at a special meeting of the Board, to be held after seven days' notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the district, and also in writing posted to or delivered at such address as the objecting party shall specify in his objection; and the Board may amend the valuation or assessment, or disallow the objection; and no such valuation or assessment shall be quashed or set aside for or on account of any irregularity or error, but any such irregularity or error shall and may be amended by the Board at the special meeting for hearing objections or any adjournment thereof; and every such amended valuation or assessment shall be as valid and effectual as if no such error or irregularity had existed therein, or as if no objection had been made thereto.
