REFERENDUM BILL.

Hon. Sir W. J. STEWARD, in Committee, to move the addition of the following new clause and subclause:—

4A. When a motion in the name of a private member of the House of Representatives in favour of submitting any legislative proposal to a referendum has become a lapsed motion by effluxion of time under the provisions of the Standing Orders of that House, such motion may, upon renewal, be set down "for vote" at a fixed hour on a day named (being a day on which private members' business has precedence), not sooner than seven clear days after such renewal; and, when the time so fixed shall have arrived, any business then pending (other than a division in progress) shall be temporarily suspended, and the motion shall be put and decided without debate.

Add to section 16:—

(c.) Any Bill or resolution dealing with the constitution of either House of Parliament, unless such Bill or resolution shall have been passed by both Houses.
