

SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER PAPER.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Tuesday, the 4th day of July, 1893.

1. Mr PALMER to move, on going into Committee of Supply, "That, as all the unemployed round Auckland go into the gumfields north of Auckland, and thus avoid the Government having to provide any relief works in that part of the colony, and as this absorption of unemployed labour entails expenses on all County Councils north of Auckland, who are unable, from poor gum-lands, to find sufficient funds to make proper roads for the gum-traffic, it is equitable and just that to assist these Councils in providing proper roads for these gum-diggers and settlers the Government should take over and metal the road north of Auckland known as the Great North Road.
