RABBIT NUISANCE ACT 1885 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. M. J. S. MACKENZIE, in Committee, to move the following new clause :—

13A. Every stockowner shall, subject as hereinafter mentioned, be entitled to vote by deputy duly appointed in writing or print under his own hand or the hand of his duly appointed attorney, in form hereinafter set out, and attested by a Justice of the Peace as shown in such form. In the event of such appointment being by an attorney, a declaration in form prescribed by section sixty-seven of "The Property Law Consolidation Act, 1883," shall be requisite, and shall be sufficient evidence to show that the person making the appointment is the attorney of the stockowner. Such attorney may appoint himself to vote for such stockowner. The appointment of a deputy shall be in the form following :—

In the matter of "The Rabbit Act 1882 Amendment Act, 1886."

To the Returning Officer for the District of

I, _____, being a stockowner in the above district, hereby appoint _____ to vote in my stead at the next election, to be held in your district, under the above-mentioned Act.

Every such appointment shall be lodged with or be sent through the post to the Returning Officer, so that he may have the same at least three days before the day appointed for the election at which it is intended to be used.
