REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. BALLANCE, in Committee, to move the following new clause,—

The Registrar by whom the death of any member of the House of Representatives is registered shall, within twelve hours of making such registration, in manner provided by the regulations relating to notices by telegraph contained in the Electoral Act, notify the fact by telegraph to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or if there be no Speaker, or if the Speaker be absent from the colony, then to the Governor. And if any Registrar shall neglect so to do he shall be liable to a penalty of five pounds for every day, or part of a day, after the expiry of the said period of twelve hours during which he shall neglect to forward such notice.

ELECTORAL BILL.

Mr. TANNER, in Committee, to move,—

In clause 20, after the word “district,” in line 7, to insert the words “who are marked therein as having voted at the last election held in that district.”

CIVIL SERVICE BILL.

Mr. TANNER, in Committee, to move that, after line 7, clause 44, the words be added,—

“Provided that, before any of the under-mentioned classes be included, all persons proposed to be thereby affected shall be served with a ballot-paper, on which he or she shall record a vote for or against the proposal, and no such class of employes shall be so included unless two-thirds of the votes recorded in that department or class shall be in favour of such adoption,” after which such Order in Council shall issue.
