MINES ACT 1877 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Pyke, in Committee, to move the following new clause:-

Wherever the Governor is by the said Act authorized or empowered to issue any Proclamation, it shall be lawful for him, from time to time, to rescind, alter, or vary the same.

REGISTRATION OF ELECTORS BILL.

Mr. Pyke, in Committee, to move the following new clause:-

If any Registrar shall fail or neglect to place on the roll the name of any claimant who is lawfully entitled to have his name placed thereon, he shall, upon conviction thereof before a Resident Magistrate, be liable to a penalty not exceeding *ten* pounds for every such offence.

REGULATION OF ELECTIONS BILL.

Hon. Mr. Hall, in Committee, to move the following amendment:

To insert the following new sections before section 16:—

POLLING-PLACES.

The Governor may from time to time appoint, alter, and abolish polling-places for each electoral district within or within one mile of the limits thereof; and may appoint any one of such polling-places to be the principal polling-place of the district.

After the issue of a writ for an election in any district, and until such election is over, no change shall be made in the polling-places appointed for such district, unless such election cannot be held

without some such change being made.

Provided always that no polling-place shall be appointed unless the Governor shall be first satisfied that the place to be appointed is more convenient than any other for at least twenty electors to record their votes thereat.
