REGULATION OF ELECTIONS BILL.

1. Mr. Barron, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

The Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the day of polling at any election, issue to each person residing within three miles of a polling-booth, and whose name is on the roll, but who is not shown by the certified copies of rolls to have claimed a voting paper, a summons under "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1866," calling upon such person to show cause why his name should not be struck off the roll, and the Court shall, upon the hearing of the summons, make such order as to costs and as to striking such name off the electoral roll as it may see fit.

2. Mr. George, in Committee, to move the following amendment:—

In section 57, after the figures "57," to insert the following words:—

If any person, being chosen a member of the House of Representatives, shall accept of any office of profit from the Crown, during such time as he shall continue a member, his election shall be and is hereby declared to be void, and a new writ shall issue for a new election, as if such person so accepting was naturally dead: Provided nevertheless that such person shall be capable of being again elected, as if his place had not become void as aforesaid, or
