

SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER PAPER.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Friday, the 4th Day of November, 1898.

Report of the Joint House Committee, presented 3rd November, 1898, as amended by the Legislative Council.

The Joint House Committee have the honour to report that they have agreed to the following resolutions:—

(1.) That notice be posted in the lobby, requesting members to observe the rule that strangers may not be admitted thereto without a permit from Mr. Speaker.

(2.) That the members of both Houses resident in Wellington be appointed a Recess Committee.

(3.) That the Recess Committee have control of Bellamy's, and sign all cheques for the same during the recess.

(4.) That, *having regard to the fact that building operations are to be carried on during the recess*, the Government be requested to take charge of the Parliament Buildings during the recess.

(5.) That Bellamy's accounts be audited up to the close of the present session.

(6.) That if at any time during the recess Mr. Letham is unable to attend personally, the cellar be placed, during his absence, under the control of the Recess Committee.

(7.) That during the recess no liquors be sold from Bellamy's to any person whomsoever.

(8.) That the Custodian be instructed to use every endeavour to have all accounts due to Bellamy's paid at an early date; and that any member whose account shall not have been paid at the conclusion of the session be not admitted to Bellamy's until it is paid.
