SHOP AND SHOP ASSISTANTS BILL.

The Hon. Mr. REEVES, in Committee, to move,—

Clause 2: Add the following definition:—

“Special resolution” means a resolution passed at a special meeting of the City or Borough Council or Town Board respectively, and of which meeting public notice shall have been given by advertisement at least *seven* days prior to the date of meeting.

After clause 6 to insert a new clause:—

6A. It shall not be deemed an offence against the provisions of this Act if a shopkeeper employ any person or keep open his shop at a port after the prescribed time of closing merely for the purpose of supplying goods to any ship, steamer, or boat arriving at such port, if such ship, steamer, or boat depart therefrom within                      hours after arrival.

Clause 8: To omit all words thereof before “change the day,” in line 47, substitute “Every City or Borough Council and every Town Board may from time to time, by special resolution as herein defined.”

Same clause, page 3, lines 1, 18, 26, 28, and 31, omit “order or by law,” substitute “resolution”; line 2, omit “and Town Board as they think fit,” substitute “or Town Board as it thinks fit respectively; line 25, omit “make,” substitute “pass”; line 27, omit “substitution,” insert “lieu”; lines 28 and 29, omit “and of offences thereunder”; line 31, after “made,” insert “under the provisions of this Act.”
