SALE OF LIQUOR AMENDMENT BILL

Proposed Amendment

Mr EAST, in Committee, to move the following amendment:

Proposed clause 75A: To insert on page 65, before clause 76 the following clause:

75A. Liquor permit for unlicensed restaurant—Section 218A of the principal Act (as inserted by section 61 (1) of the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976) is hereby amended by inserting, after subsection (1), the following subsection:

“(1A) Such a permit shall also authorise the holder to sell and supply liquor, in the form of the concoction known as Irish coffee, for consumption in the restaurant by any person who is there for the purpose of partaking of a meal at any time referred to in subsection (1) of this section.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This provision was in the Bill as originally introduced, but the Statutes Revision Committee recommended that it be dropped.

The provision allows restaurants with so-called B.Y.O. permits to sell Irish coffee.
