SALE OF LIQUOR (OFF-LICENCE) AMENDMENT BILL

Proposed Amendments

GRAEME REEVES, in Committee, to move the following amendments:

Clause 2: To omit from line 32 on page 2 the expression "subsection (1A)", and substitute the expression "subsections (1A) and (1B)".

To insert, after line 13 on page 3, the following subsection:

"(1B) Where an off-licence is granted in respect of any premises described in section 36 (1) (d) of this Act, **subsection (1)** of this section shall not apply in respect of that off-licence but it shall be a condition of that off-licence that no liquor be sold or delivered on Good Friday or Christmas Day."

Clause 3: To insert, after line 37 on page 3, the following subsection:

(1A) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, where, on the commencement of this Act, an off-licence granted in respect of any premises described in section 36 (1) (d) of this Act is in force, the conditions of that off-licence shall include not only the condition specified in section 37 (1B) of the principal Act (as substituted by section 2 (1) of this Act) but also a condition that wine may, on a Sunday, be sold and delivered pursuant to that off-licence only between 9 a.m. and 10 p.m.

To insert in line 38 on page 3, after the word "section", the words "and the condition imposed by subsection (1A) of this section".

Title: To add, after line 4 on page 2, the following paragraph:

(c) To allow wine to be sold on Sunday pursuant to offlicences granted in respect of supermarkets and grocery stores.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Clause 2: The proposed amendments allow wine to be sold on Sunday pursuant to off-licences granted in respect of supermarkets and grocery stores. The prohibition on the sale of liquor on Good Friday or Christmas Day is not affected.

Clause β is a transitional provision in respect of supermarkets and grocery stores. It makes it a condition of an off-licence in respect of a supermarket or a grocery store that, on a Sunday, wine may be sold and delivered pursuant to that off-licence only between 9 a.m. and 10 p.m.
