SALE OF LIQUOR BILL Proposed Amendment

Hon. Warren Cooper, in Committee, to move the following amendment:

Clause 205: To omit subclause (6) on page 143, and substitute the following subclauses:

(6) Subject to subsection (5) of this section, and to section 206 of this Act, the Secretary for Justice shall from time to time pay the income arising from the Fund into an account, to be called the Human Resources Development for Tourism Fund Account, to be established and kept at such bank as the Minister of Tourism may from time to time direct.

(6A) The Account shall be operated upon by cheque signed by the General Manager of the Tourist and Publicity Department, and the money for the time being standing to the credit of the Account may be applied, at the direction of the Minister of Tourism, in or towards any scheme, project, programme, course, or arrangement relating to the training, recruitment, or retention of personnel in any facet of the tourist industry.

To insert in line 11 on that page, after the words "belonging to the Fund", the words ", and all money standing to the credit of the Human Resources Development for Tourism Fund Account,".

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

As the Bill stands, any surplus money standing to the credit of the Licensing Fund may be paid into the Consolidated Fund. This amendment removes this provision. Instead, it proposes that all income from the Licensing Fund should be paid into a Human Resources Development for Tourism Fund Account, and be used for recruiting, training, and retaining personnel in the tourist industry.

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
