NOTICES OF MOTION.

1. Mr. ROLLESTON, in Committee on the Timaru and Gladstone Board of Works Amendment Bill, to move the insertion of the following amendment in the 21st section of "The Timaru and Gladstone Board of Works Act, 1869":—

The term "Timaru Harbour Works" shall be taken and construed to include all works which the Board shall deem necessary for the protection repairs or construction of any shed store or landing service now erected or hereafter to be erected for the purposes of the harbour of Timaru; and the words "Marine Engineer of the General Government" shall be taken to mean such Engineer as may be approved of, for the purpose of supervising such harbour works, by the Colonial Secretary.

2. The Honourable Colonel HAULTAIN, in Committee on the Militia Bill, to move the following amendments in the 11th clause:—

The Militia shall be divided into five classes as follows:—

First Class—All unmarried men or widowers without children between the ages of nineteen and thirty.

Second Class—All married men or widowers with children between the ages of nineteen and thirty.

Third Class—All men between the ages of thirty and forty.

Fourth Class—All men between the ages of forty and forty-five.

Fifth Class—All lads or men between the ages of seventeen and nineteen.

The third and fourth classes not to be called out for training and exercise.

The fifth class not to be called out for actual service except in case of emergency.
