TAXATION REFORM BILL (NO. 7)

Proposed Motion to Divide the Bill into 7 Bills

Hon WYATT CREECH, in Committee, to move the following motion:

That clauses 1 to 108 be a separate Bill, and that for clauses 1 and 2 and the heading to Part I there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, clause, and heading:

#### An Act to amend the Income Tax Act 1976

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Income Tax Amendment Act (No. 14) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Income Tax Act 1976 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this Act, this Act shall come into force on the day on which it receives the Royal

assent.

#### PART I

#### AMENDMENTS TO PRINCIPAL ACT

That Part III be a separate Bill, and that for clause 109 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

An Act to amend the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985 BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Goods and Services Tax Amendment Act (No. 7) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

That Part IV be a separate Bill, and that for clause 115 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

An Act to amend the Estate and Gift Duties Act 1968 BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

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1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Estate and Gift Duties Amendment Act (No. 3) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Estate and Gift Duties Act 1968 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

That *Part V* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 121* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

## An Act to amend the Stamp and Cheque Duties Act 1971

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Stamp and Cheque Duties Amendment Act (No. 5) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Stamp and Cheque Duties Act 1971 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

That *Part VI* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 130* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

### An Act to amend the Inland Revenue Department Act 1974

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Inland Revenue Department Amendment Act (No. 6) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Inland Revenue Department Act 1974 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) Except as provided in section 131 (4) of this Act, this Act shall come into force on the day on which it receives the Royal

assent.

That Part VII be a separate Bill, and that for clause 132 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

# An Act to amend the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Amendment Act (No. 5) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

That *Part VIII* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 137* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

### An Act to amend the Student Loan Scheme Act 1992

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Student Loan Scheme Amendment Act (No. 2) 1993, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Student Loan Scheme Act 1992 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the

1st day of April 1993.
