UNEMPLOYMENT BILL.

AMENDMENTS proposed by His Excellency the Governor-General:—

Clause 6: To omit from paragraph (b) the words “an old-age” in line 24, and substitute the word “any”.

Clause 14: To insert, after the words “member of the Board” in line 13, the words “save that no person associated with the Board pursuant to this section shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Board”.

Clause 17, paragraph (d): To insert, after the word “undertake” in line 50, the words “or to continue to carry on”; to insert, after the word “developmental” in the same line, the words “or other”.

To insert after clause 3, the following new clause:—

3A. (1) For the purpose of bringing this Act into effective operation forthwith after the passing thereof, or at the earliest practicable date thereafter, the Minister of Finance is hereby empowered, without further appropriation than this section and on such terms and conditions, not inconsistent with this section, as he thinks fit, to advance to the Unemployment Fund, out of the Consolidated Fund, such amounts as he from time to time determines. The amounts advanced under this section and for the time being outstanding shall not exceed in the aggregate the sum of one hundred thousand pounds.

(2) No interest shall be payable out of the Unemployment Fund in respect of any moneys advanced from the Consolidated Fund pursuant to this section.

(3) All moneys advanced from the Consolidated Fund pursuant to this section shall be repayable out of the Unemployment Fund to the Consolidated Fund as and when the Minister of Finance determines. Any amount or amounts so repaid to the Consolidated Fund shall not be included in the expenditure of the fund for the purpose of computing the amount of the subsidy payable pursuant to subsection *three* of the *last preceding* section.
