PURSUANT to section 10(2) of the Apiaries Amendment Act 1980, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Apiaries Admendment Act Commencement Order 1983.

2. Commencement of section 10 of Apiaries Amendment Act 1980—Section 10(1) of the Apiaries Amendment Act 1980 (which repeals section 35 of the Apiaries Act 1969) shall come into force on the 15th day of April 1983.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to repeal section 35 of the Apiaries Act 1969 which relates to restrictions on spraying trees and plants at times when bees may be affected by the spray. The matters dealt with by the section repealed are now covered by the provisions of regulation 14 of the Pesticides Regulations 1983 (S.R. 1983/14).
