PURSUANT to the Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Institutions Order 1974.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1974.

2. Institutions certified—Each of the hospitals named in the Schedule to this order is hereby certified as an institution under the Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Act 1966.

3. Amendment—The Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Institutions Order 1969* is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule the words "Oakley Hospital, Auckland".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 April 1974, effects the certification as institutions under the Alcoholism and Drug Addiction Act 1966 of the two hospitals created by the division of the existing Oakley Hospital.
