ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 30th day of October 1989

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 13 of the Adult Adoption Information Act 1985, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Adult Adoption Information (Fees) Regulations 1989.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1989.

2. Fees—There shall be paid to the Registrar-General, for each matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, the fee specified for it in the Schedule.

3. Amount of goods and services tax included—The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

4. Revocation—The Adult Adoption Information (Fees) Regulations 1988* are hereby consequentially revoked.
