THE ARTIFICIAL AIDS NOTICE 1954, AMENDMENT NO. 4

PURSUANT to regulation 4 of the Social Security (Hospital Benefits for Outpatients) Regulations 1947,* the Minister of Health hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the Artificial Aids Notice 1954, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Artificial Aids Notice 1954† (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice).

2. Paragraph (f) of clause 4 of the principal notice is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting the word “only”; and
- (b) By inserting, after the word “foot” where it first appears, the words “plus a further supply of two limb socks per annum”.

3. Paragraph (g) of clause 4 of the principal notice is hereby amended by adding the following additional proviso:

“Provided also that nothing in this paragraph shall apply to the limb socks supplied subsequent to the initial supply.”
