



**THE APPLE AND PEAR MARKETING REGULATIONS 1975,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 47 of the Apple and Pear Marketing Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Apple and Pear Marketing Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Apple and Pear Marketing Regulations 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1990.

2. Fruit grown in Australia not required to be purchased by Board—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 2A (as inserted by regulation 3 of the Apple and Pear Marketing Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1), the following regulation:

“2B. (1) The Board shall not be required to purchase any fruit grown in Australia.

“(2) The price paid by the Board for any fruit grown in Australia it purchases shall be a price agreed by the Board and the vendor.”

3. Permitted sales of fruit grown in Australia—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 5A (as inserted by regulation 4 of the Apple and Pear Marketing Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1), the following regulation:

“5B. Any person may sell any fruit grown in Australia to any other person in any quantity.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1990, exempt apples and pears grown in Australia from the powers of compulsory purchase of the New Zealand Apple and Pear Marketing Board, and (subject to the usual phytosanitary requirements) permits their unrestricted sale in New Zealand.
