ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Accident Compensation Act 1982, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Accident Compensation (Prescribed Amounts for Calculation and Payment of Levies) Order Revocation Order 1991.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 8th day of February 1992.

2. Revocation—The Accident Compensation (Prescribed Amounts for Calculation and Payment of Levies) Order 1985* is hereby revoked.

3. Saving—Notwithstanding the revocation of the Accident Compensation (Prescribed Amounts for Calculation and Payment of Levies) Order 1985 by clause 2 of this order, that order shall remain in force in respect of any due date within the meaning of section 44 of the

Accident Compensation Act 1982 occurring during the period of 12 months beginning on the 8th day of February 1992, except that the proviso to clause 4 (a) of that Order shall not apply.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 8 February 1992, revokes the Accident Compensation (Prescribed Amounts for Calculation and Payment of Levies) Order 1985. Despite the revocation, the prescribed minimum amounts for full-time self-employed persons and other self-employed persons remain in force in respect of the statements of earnings required to be made on due dates during the year beginning on 8 February 1992. However, the power for full-time self-employed persons to elect a higher amount (the so called "optional scheme for the self-employed") is not continued in force.

The continuation in force is because, generally, self-employed persons pay levies in arrears.
