ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of September 1979

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Accident Compensation Act 1972, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Accident Compensation Earners' Scheme Levies Order 1973, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Accident Compensation Earners' Scheme Levies Order 1973* (here-inafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—In this order the expression "income year" has the same meaning as in section 2 of the Income Tax Act 1976.

3. Application—This order shall apply to earnings as a self-employed person derived during a financial year which corresponds with the income year that commenced on the 1st day of April 1979 or any succeeding income year.

4. Prescribing the rate of levy payable in respect of earnings as a selfemployed person—Clause 4 (a) of the principal order is hereby amended by omitting the words "one dollar", and substituting the expression "\$1.07".
