



**THE ACCIDENT COMPENSATION MOTOR VEHICLE LEVIES
ORDER (NO. 2) 1982**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of May 1982

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Accident Compensation Act 1972, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Accident Compensation Motor Vehicle Levies Order (No. 2) 1982.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Goods service vehicle” has the same meaning as in section 2 of the Transport Act 1962:

“Licensing year” has the same meaning as in section 6 of the Transport Act 1962:

“Motorcar” has the same meaning as in section 2 of the Transport Act 1962:

“Motor vehicle” has the same meaning as in section 2 of the Transport Act 1962:

“Omnibus” has the same meaning as in the Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1978:

“Service coach” has the same meaning as in the Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1978:

“Veteran or vintage motor vehicle” means any motor vehicle that was either—

(a) Manufactured before 1 January 1919; or

(b) Manufactured not less than 40 years prior to the commencement of the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of July 1982 or to the commencement of any subsequent licensing year.

3. Levies—The annual levies payable under Part IV of the Act shall, for the licensing year commencing on the 1st day of July 1982 and any subsequent licensing year, be as set out in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto and the classes of motor vehicles for the purpose of levies shall be those set out and described in Columns 1 and 2 of the said Schedule.

4. Revocation—The Accident Compensation Motor Levies Order 1982* is hereby revoked.

This order replaces the Accident Compensation Motor Levies Order 1982 and revises the motor vehicle levies payable under the Accident Compensation Act 1972 for the licensing year commencing on 1 July 1982 and subsequent years.
