ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 30th day of May 1994

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 167 of the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations Revocation Order 1994.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1994.
 - 2. **Revocations**—(1) The following regulations are hereby revoked:
 - (a) The Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations 1990*:
 - (b) The Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 1†:

- (c) The Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 2*.
- (2) The Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance (Costs Regulations Amendment) Regulations 1992† are hereby consequentially amended by revoking so much of the Schedule as relates to the Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations 1990.
- **3. Savings**—Notwithstanding clause 2 of this order, where treatment that is a laboratory test or service has been provided to a claimant by a laboratory at any time before the close of the 30th day of June 1994, the regulations revoked by clause 2 of this order shall continue to apply in respect of the treatment so provided as if those regulations had not been revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 1994, revokes the Accident Compensation (Laboratory Services Costs) Regulations 1990 and their amendments.

The purchasing responsibility for the laboratory services to which those regulations relate is being transferred on that date to regional health authorities.

The revocations do not affect payment for laboratory tests or services provided before 1 July 1994.
