ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of September 1981

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 24 of the Animals Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Animal Diseases Order 1981.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Diseases—The Second Schedule to the Animals Act 1967 is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from the item relating to brucellosis the words “of cattle”;
- (b) By inserting, after the name of the disease “lymphomatosis”, the name of the disease “maedi-visna”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order provides that the disease of brucellosis occurring in any animal, not just in cattle, is to be a Second Schedule disease for the purposes of the Animals Act 1967. The disease of maedi-visna is also added to that Schedule.
