

THE ASBESTOS DUST (CONCENTRATION OF FIBRES) NOTICE 1981

Pursuant to regulation 30 of the Asbestos Regulations 1978, the Director-General of Health hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Asbestos Dust (Concentration of Fibres) Notice 1981.
 - (2) This notice shall come into force on the 31st day of October 1981.
- 2. Definition of "asbestos dust"—For the purposes of the Asbestos Regulations 1978* "asbestos dust" shall be any concentration of asbestos fibres in the air exceeding those specified in respect of the different types of asbestos in the Schedule to this notice.
- **3. Revocation**—The Asbestos Dust (Concentration of Fibres) Notice 1979† is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Types of Asbestos	Concentration
Actinolite, amosite, antho- phyllite, chrysotile, tre- molite	(a) An average concentration over any 4-hour period of 1 fibre per millilitre of air; and (b) A maximum concentration over any
Crocidolite	10-minute period of 6 fibres per millilitre of air. A concentration over any 10-minute period of 0.2 fibres per millilitre of air.
