

## THE ASBESTOS DUST (CONCENTRATION OF FIBRES) NOTICE 1983

Pursuant to regulation 31 of the Asbestos Regulations 1983, the Director-General of Health hereby gives the following notice.

## NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Asbestos Dust (Concentration of Fibres) Notice 1983.
  - (2) This notice shall come into force on 1st day of August 1983.
- **2. Definition of "asbestos dust"**—For the purposes of the Asbestos Regulations 1983\* "asbestos dust" shall be any concentration of asbestos fibres in the air exceeding those specified in respect of the different types of asbestos in the Schedule to this notice.
- **3. Revocation**—The Asbestos Dust (Concentration of Fibres) Notice 1981† is hereby revoked.

## **SCHEDULE**

Types of Asbestos	Concentration
Actinolite, amosite, anthophyllite, chryso- tile, tremolite	(a) An average concentration over any 4-hour period of 1 fibre per millilitre of air; and (b) A maximum concentration over any 10-minute period of 6 fibres per millilitre of air.
Crocidolite	A concentration over any 4-hour period of 0.1 fibres per millilitre of air.
