THE ALIENAGE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 17th day of June, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Alienage Emergency Regulations 1942.
- 2. So long as these regulations continue in force, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928, it shall not be competent for any person to renounce British nationality by making in New Zealand a declaration of alienage, under clause 14 or clause 15 of the Second Schedule to that Act.
- 3. Nothing herein contained shall affect clause 5 of the First Schedule to the British Nationality and Status of Aliens (in New Zealand) Act, 1928, or the right to make a declaration of alienage conferred by that clause.
