PURSUANT to the Navy Act 1954, the New Zealand Army Act 1950, and the Royal New Zealand Air Force Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Armed Forces Equivalent Ranks Order 1970, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Armed Forces Equivalent Ranks Order 1970* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Table of equivalent ranks—The Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended—

- (a) Under the heading “New Zealand Army” “Soldiers” in column 2—
 - (i) By omitting the word “Bombadier”, and substituting the word “Bombardier”;
 - (ii) By omitting the word “Lance-bombadier”, and substituting the word “Lance-bombardier”;
- (b) By inserting after the words “Leading Wren”, under the heading “Women’s Royal New Zealand Naval Service” “Ratings” in column 4, the words “(but junior to Bombardier and Corporal)”;
- (c) By omitting from the second footnote the word “Bombadier”, and substituting the word “Bombardier”;
- (d) By omitting from the Note the word “(Male)”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The main purposes of this order are to clarify the relative rank of a Leading Wren, and to take account of the fact that the appointment of officer cadet applies to both males and females.
