THE AIR FORCE PAY AND ALLOWANCES NOTICE 1960

PURSUANT to regulation 31A of the Air Force Regulations 1952,* the Minister of Defence, with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the Air Force Pay and Allowances Notice 1960.

2. Except where this notice otherwise provides, this notice shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of October 1959.

3. The pay, allowances, expenses, and grants payable to officers and airmen of the Regular Air Force, officers and airmen of the Territorial Air Force, officers and airmen of the Air Force Reserve, officers and airwomen of the Women's Royal New Zealand Air Force, and officers and cadets of the Air Training Corps, and the amounts of qualifying allotments under the Air Force Regulations 1952,* shall be those specified in the First, Second, and Third Schedules to this notice.
