

## ACCIDENT INSURANCE (SELF-EMPLOYED WORK ACCOUNT PREMIUMS) REGULATIONS 1999

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

### Present:

THE RIGHT HON JENNY SHIPLEY PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 407 of the Accident Insurance Act 1998, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister for Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance after consultation in accordance with sections 408 and 409 of the Act, makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Accident Insurance (Self-Employed Work Account Premiums) Regulations 1999.
  - (2) These regulations come into force on 1 July 1999.
- **2. Interpretation**—(1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The Act" means the Accident Insurance Act 1998:

- "Income benefit portion" means that part of the self-employed work account premium that has been calculated and set to provide income benefits to self-employed persons and private domestic workers:
- "Non-income benefit portion" means that part of the self-employed work account premium that has been calculated and set to provide non-income benefits to self-employed persons and private domestic workers:
- "Premium liability year" means any income year for which the selfemployed person or private domestic worker was liable to pay a self-employed work account premium under the Act (or an employment premium under section 102 of the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992):
- "Self-employed work account premium" means the premium payable by a self-employed person or a private domestic worker under section 300 of the Act and comprises an income benefit portion and a non-income benefit portion.
- (2) In these regulations, "activity" means a business, industry, profession, trade, or undertaking of a self-employed person or a private domestic worker. Ancillary or subservient functions relating to the activity, such as administration, management, marketing and distribution, technical support, maintenance, and product development must be treated as part of the activity and not as separate activities.

### Classification

- **3. Classification of self-employed persons and private domestic workers**—(1) A self-employed person and a private domestic worker must be classified in the classification unit set out in Schedule 1 that most accurately describes his or her activity.
  - (2) This regulation is subject to regulations 4 and 5.
- 4. Classification of self-employed persons and private domestic workers engaged in 2 or more activities—(1) A self-employed person and a private domestic worker who is engaged in 2 or more activities must be classified in the classification unit for whichever of those activities of the person attracts the highest premium rate under these regulations.
- (2) If a particular activity accounts for 5% or less of a self-employed person's or a private domestic worker's earnings for the income year, then

that activity need not be considered when determining the correct classification under subclause (1).

- (3) Subclause (2) applies only if sufficient and accurate records are maintained by the self-employed person or the private domestic worker to satisfy the manager that the apportionment of earnings in the income year is correct.
- **5. Power of manager to determine classification and rate**—(1) If there is no classification unit set out in Schedule 1 that describes the activity of a self-employed person or a private domestic worker, then the self-employed person or the private domestic worker, or a representative of the self-employed person or private domestic worker, may apply to the manager for a determination of a classification unit.
  - (2) The manager must then determine—
  - (a) A classification unit for that activity, which is to apply to all selfemployed persons and, subject to section 13 of the Act, private domestic workers involved in that activity; and
  - (b) An income benefit portion rate and a non-income benefit portion rate for that classification unit.
- (3) If a self-employed person or private domestic worker is uncertain which, if any, classification unit applies to the activity of the self-employed person or private domestic worker, or if the manager disagrees with the classification that the self-employed person or private domestic worker has adopted, the manager may—
  - (a) Determine which classification unit is to apply to that activity; or
  - (b) Determine, under subclause (2), a classification unit and the income benefit and non-income benefit portion rates for that activity.
- (4) A classification unit determined under subclause (2) must be treated as if it were a classification unit set out in Schedule 1.
- **6. Self-employed work account premium**—(1) The self-employed work account premium payable by a self-employed person and a private domestic worker in an income year must be paid at the premium rate that applies to the classification unit in which the self-employed person or private domestic worker is classified under these regulations.
- (2) The amount of self-employed work account premium is calculated using the following formula:

$$a + b$$

where—

- a is the amount of income benefit portion calculated in accordance with regulation 7; and
- b is the amount of non-income benefit portion calculated in accordance with regulation 8.
- (3) The amount of self-employed work account premium may be adjusted to provide a premium discount using the personal adjustment factors set out in regulation 9.
- (4) Goods and services tax is payable on self-employed work account premiums.
- **7. Income benefit portion**—The amount of income benefit portion is calculated using the following formula:

$$\frac{c}{100} \times d$$

where—

- c is the amount of earnings derived by the self-employed person or private domestic worker in the income year; and
- d is the income benefit portion rate.
- **8. Non-income benefit portion**—The amount of non-income benefit portion is an amount equal to the smaller of the following amounts:
  - (a) An amount equal to the greater of the following amounts:
    - (i) \$32; or
    - (ii) An amount calculated using the following formula:

$$\frac{a}{100} \times e$$

where-

- a is the amount of earnings derived by the self-employed person or private domestic worker in the income year;
   and
- e is the non-income benefit portion rate; or
- (b) An amount equal to the greater of the following amounts:
  - (i) \$32; or
  - (ii) An amount calculated using the following formula:

$$\frac{15,000}{100} \times e$$

where-

- e is the non-income benefit portion rate.
- **9. Categories of earners: personal adjustment factors**—(1) A self-employed person or a private domestic worker who provides the manager with details of age and gender is eligible for the relevant age or gender discount as determined using the table in Schedule 2.
- (2) A self-employed person or a private domestic worker who has not had a work-related personal injury claim in the 3 premium liability years preceding the relevant income year is entitled to a claims experience discount calculated at 10% of the self-employed work account premium that would otherwise be payable by that self-employed person or private domestic worker.
- 10. Premium rates—(1) The premium rate for each classification unit (other than a new classification unit determined under regulation 5) is set out in Schedule 1.
- (2) The premium rates, whether set out in Schedule 1 or determined under regulation 5, are expressed—
  - (a) As dollars per \$100 of earnings in the income year; and
  - (b) As an annual rate; and
  - (c) Exclusive of goods and services tax.
- 11. Maximum earnings on which self-employed work account premium is payable—The maximum amount of earnings on which a self-employed work account premium is payable by a self-employed person or private domestic worker is \$83,017 in an income year.

12. Minimum premiums payable by self-employed persons or private domestic workers working more than 30 hours a week— (1) A self-employed person or private domestic worker who, in an income year,—

(a) Works for more than an average of 30 hours a week as a selfemployed person or private domestic worker; and

- (b) Earns less than the specified amount must pay a self-employed work account premium of the specified amount multiplied by the premium rate for the classification unit that the selfemployed person or private domestic worker is classified in under these regulations.
  - (2) The specified amount is,—
  - (a) In the case of a self-employed person or a private domestic worker who is aged 20 or over on the last day of the income year, \$14,560:
  - (b) In the case of a self-employed person or a private domestic worker who is under the age of 20 on the last day of the income year, \$11,256.
- 13. Lesser penalties to apply to unpaid self-employed work account premiums—(1) If any self-employed work account premium payable under the Act is unpaid within 2 months of the date on which it was due, the penalty owing to the manager under section 322 (2) is not 3 times the unpaid premium but is set out in subclause (2).

(2) The penalty is the sum of—

- (a) 1% of the unpaid premium calculated on a monthly basis on the first day of each calendar month after the penalty-free period; and
- (b) An amount of \$4 for every complete month after the penalty-free period.

(3) In subclause (2),—

- "Penalty-free period" means the period of 2 months after the due date:
- "Unpaid premium" means the unpaid premium on the relevant day together with any unpaid penalty under subclause 2 (a) and (b) on that day.
- (4) The penalty must not exceed 3 times the amount of the unpaid premium on the date on which it was due.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1999, set the work premiums for self-employed persons and private domestic workers who do not have accident insurance contracts. The premiums fund the Self-Employed Work Account.

These regulations set the minimum amount of earnings on which self-employed work premium is payable by self-employed persons or private domestic workers, and who work (whether as an employee or not) for more than 30 hours a week. For those aged 20 or over the new figure is \$14,560, and for those under the age of 20 it is \$11,256.

The maximum amount of earnings on which a self-employed work premium is payable is \$83,017 per annum.
