## THE AIR NAVIGATION REGULATIONS, 1933, AMENDMENT NO. 5.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Air Navigation Act, 1931.

Date on which the regulations were made: 16th day of September,

Date of notification in Gazette: 1st day of October, 1936.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority vested in him by the Air Navigation Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto the Air Navigation Regulations, 1933, published in the Gazette dated 1st June, 1933.

## SCHEDULE.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation Regulations, 1933, Amendment No. 5.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Air Navigation Regulations, 1933\* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the Gazette of the making hereof.

## SCHEDULE V.—LICENSING OF PERSONNEL.

4. Regulation 4, subclause (c), of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words from "not" in line 1 to the end of the sentence, and substituting the following words:

"The maximum period of validity shall be twenty-four months, irrespective of whether the holder is of the male or the female sex."

5. Regulation 11, subclause (d), of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after "age" the following words:—

"Provided that, at the discretion of the Minister, a relaxation may be made as regards the upper age limit if, prior to the date of his application, he has been in service as pilot of a State aircraft."

6. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking

subclause (c), and substituting the following:-

"(c) Be nineteen years of age and not more than fifty years of age:

Provided that, at the discretion of the Minister, a relaxation
may be made as regards the upper age limit if, up to the
date of his application, he has been in service as an
operative member of the crew of an aircraft."
