# THE AGREEMENT ON COMMERCE (JAPAN) ORDER 1963

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 10th day of July 1963

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 5 of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by subsection (3) of section 11 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Agreement on Commerce (Japan) Order 1963.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.

2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the Most Favoured Nation Tariff set out in the Customs Tariff, being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of Japan.

3. Subject to the provisions of the Cook Islands Customs Duties Order 1962\* (as from time to time modified, whether before or after the commencement of this order), this order shall be in force in the Cook Islands.

4. The provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

5. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

6. This order is in substitution for the Agreement on Commerce (Japan) Order 1959,\* and that order is hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order replaces the Agreement on Commerce (Japan) Order 1959. It provides for the continued application of the Most Favoured Nation Tariff to Japanese goods imported into New Zealand, and extends this treatment to such goods imported into the Cook Islands.
