**THE ANIMALS PROTECTION AND GAME REGULATIONS  
1939, AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 29th day of  
November, 1939.

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Animals Protection and Game Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Animals Protection and Game Regulations 1939\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.

4. Clause (1) of Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following clause substituted :—

“(1) Except as hereinafter provided, all fees paid for licenses issued by an officer of a registered acclimatization society shall be paid to and belong to that society. In respect of each license issued by an officer of a registered acclimatization society in the North Island at a fee of thirty shillings (30s.) there shall be paid by that society to the Council of the North Island acclimatization societies the sum of five shillings (5s.) to be devoted by that Council to the payment of bonuses for the destruction of hawks, stoats, ferrets, pole-cats, weasels, and such other birds and animals as may from time to time be recommended by that Council and approved by the Minister, to persons in the North Island other than officers or paid rangers of a registered acclimatization society.”
