HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Antarctica Act 1960, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Antarctica (Specially Protected Areas) Order 1971.
 - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1972.
- 2. New specially protected area—Annex B to the Agreed Measures for the Conservation of Antarctic Fauna and Flora, set out in the Second Schedule to the Antarctica Act 1960 (as added by section 3 of the Antarctica Amendment Act 1970), is hereby amended by adding the item set out in the Schedule to this order.

16. Coppermine Peninsula, Robert Island. Lat. 62° 23'S, long. 59° 42'W.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order adds a further area to the list of specially protected areas in Antarctica.
