THE ANIMALS PROTECTION (MUTTON BIRD) WARRANT 1947

Pursuant to section 4 of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921–22, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant may be cited as the Animals Protection (Mutton Bird) Warrant 1947.
- 2. This Warrant shall take effect on the day following the date of notification thereof in the *Gazette*.
- 3. The Mutton Bird (Puffinus griseus) shall be protected in that part of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

The whole of the mainland of Stewart Island or Rakiura, excepting only thereout all that area of land situate in Block X, Lords River District, commencing at a point at mean high-water mark on the coast-line of Cooey Cove in line with the southern boundary of Section 8, Block X, Lords River District; thence due east across a road reserve to and along the southern boundary of Section 8 aforesaid, across a road reserve to a point at mean high-water mark on the coast-line in line with the southern boundary of Section 8 aforesaid; thence in a southerly, westerly, and northerly direction generally along the mean high-water mark of the coast-line to the point of commencement.
