ORDER IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 3a of the Agricultural Pests Destruction Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title—This order may be cited as the Agricultural Pests (Exemption of Domestic Rabbits) Order 1980.
- 2. Exemption from Act—The breeds of rabbits specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from the provisions of the Agricultural Pests Destruction Act 1967, subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Every such rabbit shall at all times be securely housed or restrained in such a manner as will prevent its escape:
 - (b) A rabbit shall not be kept in such a manner as will allow it to range freely or to graze pasture:
 - (c) A rabbit of any breed specified in the Schedule hereto shall not be cross-bred with a feral or wild rabbit.

SCHEDULE

Purebred rabbits of the breeds commonly known as-

- 1. New Zealand White.
- 2. Angora.
- 3. Flemish Giant.
- 4. Rex
- 5. Chinchilla.
- 6. Californian.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order exempts, subject to conditions, 6 breeds of domestic rabbit from the provisions of the Agricultural Pests Destruction Act 1967.
