

# THE ANTHRAX PREVENTION REGULATIONS 1951, AMENDMENT NO. 2

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 12th day of April 1966

Pursuant to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Anthrax Prevention Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Anthrax Prevention Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Anthrax Prevention Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1) the words "Whenuapai Aerodrome, Wellington Airport, or Harewood Aerodrome", and substituting the words "Auckland International Airport, Whenuapai Aerodrome, Ohakea Aerodrome, Wellington Airport, or Christchurch Airport."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Hair and bristle obtained from any animal in any of the countries specified in the Schedule to the Anthrax Prevention Regulations 1951 may be imported into New Zealand only where the consignments come in through certain listed ports and aerodromes. Those regulations are now amended by the addition of Auckland International Airport and Ohakea Aerodrome to the list of aerodromes.
