



**THE ANIMALS QUARANTINE AND IMPORT INSPECTION FEES
REGULATIONS 1985**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of June 1985

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Animals Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Animals Quarantine and Import Inspection Fees Regulations 1985.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Application of regulations—(1) These regulations shall apply in respect of animals and animal products imported or introduced into New Zealand on and after the date of commencement of these regulations.

(2) In respect of animals and animal products imported or introduced into New Zealand before the date of commencement of these regulations, the regulations specified in regulation 7 of these regulations shall continue to apply as if these regulations had not been made.

3. Fees and charges—(1) Fees in respect of sustenance, care, and miscellaneous costs shall be payable as follows:

Calves or fawns born while in transit to New Zealand or in quarantine	7.20

Swine (sow plus litter)	20.40
Dogs	6.00
Dogs—pups under 2 months old	3.00

(2) Testing charges shall be payable as follows:

Cattle and deer—	
For each animal	15.00
Plus blue tongue test (serology carried out overseas)	30.00
Plus blue tongue test (animal transmission)	30.00
Horses, asses, mules, sheep, goats, deer, pigs, and dogs—	
The costs of any tests, examinations, or treatment of these animals required to be carried out at the direction of the Director-General or Chief Veterinary Officer shall be charged to the importer at the actual costs of the service at the time.	

4. Veterinary, inspection, and supervision fees—The following fees shall be payable for the examination, inspection, and supervision in respect of animals not quarantined:

Dogs and cats:	\$
For one animal	17.00
For each additional animal the property of the same owner	4.50
Horses, asses, and mules:	
For one animal	20.00
For each additional animal the property of the same owner	5.00
Birds, lizards, and fish (excluding ornamental fish):	
For each consignment	20.00
Toads, mice, animal semen, animal fertilised ova, and eggs:	
For each consignment	8.00
Circus animals, animals for zoological gardens, etc.:	
Animals belonging to a circus or menagerie, performing animals, wild or domesticated animals, animals for zoological gardens, and animals not otherwise provided for:	
For one animal	20.00
For each additional animal	5.00
Maximum fee for any one circus or menagerie or consignment of animals	125.00

Sheep and goats:	
For one animal	20.00
For each additional animal up to 20, the property of the same owner	5.00
For each 10 (and such number as may be less than 10) additional animals over 20 and up to 100, the property of the same owner	15.00
For each 10 (and such number as may be less than 10) additional animals over 100, the property of the same owner	15.50
Ornamental fish:	
For each consignment:	
Per box per consignment	18.00
Minimum charge	90.00
Maximum charge	180.00

5. Other charges and expenses—Besides the charges specified in regulation 3 of these regulations for transport, sustenance, care, testing, and dipping, the costs and expenses of disinfecting animals, or the vessel by which they arrive, or the vehicle on which they are conveyed to the quarantine station, or the fittings used in connection with the animals, or the effects of their attendants, as well as all other charges and expenses of every description incurred in connection with the importation of animals shall be payable by the importer.

6. Fees in respect of animal products, etc.—Fees in respect of any animal product (including animal manure) introduced into New Zealand, and any vehicle, conveyance, fitting, or article of any kind which may have come into contact with any such animal product, shall be payable as follows:

(a) For fumigation or other treatment—	\$
Consignment of up to 1 m ³	No fee
Where consignment is more than 1 m ³ , each 0.5 m ³ or part thereof up to 3 m ³	8.60
Each 0.5 m ³ or part thereof in excess of 3 m ³	5.30
(b) For the destruction of a consignment or part consignment—	
Where consignment or part to be destroyed does not exceed 1 m ³	No fee
Where such consignment or part exceeds 1 m ³ , each 0.5 m ³ or part thereof	2.70

7. Revocations—The following regulations are hereby revoked:

- (a) The Animals Quarantine and Import Inspection Fees Regulations 1976*;
- (b) The Animals Quarantine and Import Inspection Fees Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 1†;
- (c) The Animals Quarantine and Import Inspection Fees Regulations 1976, Amendment No. 2‡.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the fees payable in respect of—

- (a) The transport, care, inspection, and other treatment of animals imported into New Zealand;
- (b) The fumigation or other treatment, or the destruction of, certain animal products introduced into New Zealand.
