Pursuant to the Arms Act, 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Arms Regulations 1931, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Arms Regulations 1931* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1951.
- 2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule, and substituting the following Schedule:—
