

THE AUCTIONEERS REGULATIONS 1958

COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of February 1958

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Auctioneers Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

Title and Commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Auctioneers Regulations 1958.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,— "The Act" means the Auctioneers Act 1928:
"Licence" means an auctioneer's licence under the Act.

Forms

- 3. (1) The forms set out in the First Schedule to these regulations are hereby prescribed as the forms to be used in respect of the several matters to which those forms relate.
- (2) Such variations may be made in any form hereby prescribed as the circumstances of any particular case may require.

Fees

4. (1) The fees specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations are hereby prescribed as the fees payable in respect of the several matters specified in that Schedule.

(2) The fees hereby prescribed for a licence shall be payable in respect of the issue and of every renewal of a licence:

Provided that, if a licence is issued to take effect after the 30th day of September in any year, only half the prescribed fees shall be payable.
(3) The fees hereby prescribed shall be payable in respect of every

licence that takes effect on any date on or after the 1st day of April 1958 or the renewal of which takes effect on or after that date.

Apportionment of Fees

5. (1) Ten per cent of every prescribed fee of £5 or more and the whole of any other fee shall be applied towards defraying the cost of

administering the Act.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subclauses (1) and (3) of this regulation, the Registrar of the Magistrate's Court to whom the prescribed fees are paid shall pay the same to the local authority or local authorities named by the applicant, being in every case a local authority within whose district the applicant proposes to conduct auction sales under the licence:

Provided that, where an applicant proposes to conduct auction sales in more than one district, he may apportion the amount among two or more local authorities on the basis of the business that he expects to do

in the several districts.

(3) Any local authority in whose district the applicant proposes to conduct auction sales under the licence may, within twenty-eight days of the issue or renewal of the licence, or within such further time as the Magistrate may allow, appeal to a Magistrate against any nomination made by the applicant under subclause (2) of this regulation, and the Magistrate, after hearing all interested local authorities, shall make such order as to the local authorities entitled to receive the fees and in what proportions as appears to him to be just and equitable in the circumstances of the case. Every such appeal shall be made by way of originating application in accordance with the Magistrates' Courts Rules 1948.*

Revocation

6. The Auctioneers Regulations 1929† are hereby revoked.

 - (c) Where the company has more than one place of business, additional fee in respect of each place of business specified in the licence (other than the first) from which it carries on the business of an auctioneer
 - 2. For every other licence (except as provided in clause 3)

 Provided that, where applications are made for the issue of licences authorising two or more persons to conduct auction sales from the same place of business (being members or employees of the applicant's firm, or the applicant and his employee or the employees of the applicant), the fee for each such licence after the

first shall be £5.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the forms to be used for applications for auctioneers' licences and other forms relating to licences, and prescribe the fees payable in respect of licences and other applications made under the Auctioneers Act 1928. The regulations also prescribe the amounts to be deducted from fees paid and applied towards the cost of administering the Act, and the amounts of the fees to be paid to local authorities in whose districts the licensees carry on business.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in Gazette: 27 February 1958.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Justice.
