### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 16th day of March 1987

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 43 of the Auctioneers Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Auctioneers Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Auctioneers Regulations 1958\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1987.

**2. New scale of fees substituted**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Auctioneers Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The fees prescribed by subclause (1) of this regulation shall be payable in respect of every licence that takes effect on any date on or after the 1st day of April 1987 or the renewal of which takes effect on or after that date.

### “SECOND SCHEDULE

#### SCALE OF FEES

	\$
1. For the issue or renewal of any licence . . . . .	300
2. On application by a company to add the name of a person authorised to conduct auction sales under a licence . . . . .	130
3. Notice by a company of each additional place of business . . . . .	130

For the purposes of item 3 of this Schedule, only a branch office or place in charge of a resident officer of a company from which auctioneering activities are arranged and at which the books and ledgers relating to those activities are kept for the area controlled by the branch shall be deemed to be a place of business from which the company carries on business as an auctioneer.”

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prescribe a new scale of fees for various matters under the Auctioneers Act 1928. A fee of \$300 is prescribed for the issue or renewal of any licence. The present fee is \$150, with a lesser fee payable where 2 or more licences are sought for members or employees of a firm, or for a licence that is available only in a special district under section 28 of the Auctioneers Act 1928.
