**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 9th day of October 1978

PURSUANT to the Apprentices Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

---

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Apprentices Regulations 1963, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Apprentices Regulations 1963\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Apprentices' lodging allowances and travelling allowances**—Regulation 29 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "any apprentice", the words "who entered into his contract of apprenticeship before the 1st day of August 1978".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations provide that a lodging allowance will not be paid to any apprentice who is required to live away from home in order to learn his trade, unless he entered into his contract of apprenticeship before 1 August 1978. However, apprentices who are required to live away from home in order to attend courses of instruction may still be paid lodging allowances.
