HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Admiralty Act 1973, the Judicature Act 1908, and the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and at least two of the other members of the Rules Committee (of whom at least one was a Judge of the High Court), hereby makes the following rules.

RULES

1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the Admiralty Rules 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Admiralty Rules 1975* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).

(2) These rules shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Security (or bail)—(1) Rule 20 (1) of the principal rules is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) By an insurance company carrying on business in New Zealand; or”.

(2) The Schedule to the principal rules is hereby amended by omitting from form 13 the word "approved".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules amend rule 20 of the Admiralty Rules 1975. Paragraph (a) of that rule, as made in 1975, provides that security may be given under those rules by an insurance company carrying on business in New Zealand and approved by the Governor-General in Council for the purposes of section 15(4) of the Administration Act 1969. Section 15 of the Administration Act 1969 was repealed in 1979. The effect of the amendment is to delete from rule 20(1)(a) the reference to the insurance company being approved by the Governor-General for the purposes of section 15(4) of the Administration Act 1969.
