PURSUANT to section 109 of the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance (Motor Spirits Excise Duty) Order 1995.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Amount of motor spirits excise duty payable to Corporation—For the purposes of section 109 of the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Act 1992, the amount to be paid from the Crown Bank Account to the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Corporation in respect of the year ending with the 30th day of June 1996 is hereby determined as \$66.15 million (inclusive of goods and services tax).

- **3. Revocation and saving**—(1) The Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance (Motor Spirits Excise Duty) Order 1994* is hereby revoked.
- (2) Notwithstanding the revocation of the order referred to in subclause (1) of this regulation, that order shall continue in force for the purposes of every payment to be made, in accordance with that order, on or before the 30th day of June 1995.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order determines the amount, in respect of the year ending 30 June 1996, which is to be transferred from the Crown Bank Account to the Accident Rehabilitation and Compensation Insurance Corporation. The prescribed amount is \$66.15 million (inclusive of goods and services tax) which represents 2 cents per litre of the excise duty payable on motor spirits. The amount transferred is to be used for the purposes of paying public health care costs in respect of motor vehicle injuries.
