PURSUANT to section 65 of the Animal Remedies Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Animal Remedies Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Animal Remedies Regulations 1980* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Second Schedule amended—Clause 3 of the Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “and poultry”, and substituting the words “poultry, cat, and dog”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of this amendment is to require a veterinary prescription for cat or dog feed supplements that contain more than 300 ppm of selenium.
