THE AIR-RAID SHELTER LABOUR LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1942

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary for securing the public safety and the defence of New Zealand, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,* do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Air-raid Shelter Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1942.
- 2. This Order applies to workers engaged on tunnelling work in connection with the construction of air-raid shelters.
- 3. The provisions of all Acts and regulations and Orders thereunder, and of all awards and industrial agreements under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all agreements under the Labour Disputes Investigation Act, 1913, and of all voluntary agreements affecting conditions of employment shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as they operate to prevent the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof from entering into contracts on a co-operative basis for the carrying-out of tunnelling work in connection with the construction of air-raid shelters.
 - 4. This Order shall come into effect on the day of the date hereof. Dated at Wellington, this 2nd day of March, 1942.
