THE ACCLIMATIZATION SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of December, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in him by the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Acclimatization Society Membership Emergency Regulations 1942.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the rules of any acclimatization society registered under the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, any person who by virtue of his having purchased a license to take or kill native game or imported game or both in any acclimatization district during the year 1941 became a member of the society of that district shall, subject to any rule of that society regarding resignation or disqualification on account of convictions for breaches of the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, or the Fisheries Act, 1908, remain, and be deemed to have remained, a member of that society until the date of commencement of the next open season for native game or for imported game or for both, as the case may be, in that district.
